Dear SAA Families.

I cannot believe that we have finished our 6th year!!! It has been another fantastic year, full of learning and reading! As summer nears, I know that we are all looking forward to a summer break that is full of possibilities, especially the possibilities that books provide us. This packet includes our guidelines for summer reading at SAA, and some resources that will help you and your children enjoy a summer full of reading fun and adventure.

What is the purpose of summer reading? At SAA, we want to help our students prevent the summer slide. The summer slide is defined as the loss of academic skills over the summer break. Experts agree that students who read during the summer maintain or gain reading skills, but those who do not, lose those skills. We also want our students to strengthen the behaviors and habits of lifelong reading, to pursue interests, and to find enjoyment in reading.

All returning students, and incoming 1st through 8th grade students, are required to read two books over the summer and to complete a project on one of the books read. The lists of acceptable projects for each grade level are attached to this letter. The project should be completed according to the grade your child will be for the 2019-2020 school year. Each student will present his/her project during Language Arts the first week of school. After your child has presented the project, the Language Arts teacher will give out a ticket. On Friday, during lunch, students will come to the main office with their ticket to get a special treat.

This year's summer reading theme is "A Universe of Stories". Corresponding to the 50th anniversary of the Apollo moon landing, this spacey theme is sure to appeal to patrons of all ages! This is also inspired by illustrator, Leeza Hernandez. Sarasota County Libraries are an amazing asset to our community. Please check out their website, http://www.scgov.net/government/departments/libraries, to discover all of the cool things our library system has to offer! Barnes and Noble is being very generous again this summer. Attached, you will find a Barnes & Noble reading log. Fill out the reading log with eight books read over the summer and receive a free book!

While we do not have a set reading list, students must read a book that is on their reading level and appropriate for their age. There are so many books out there and it can be difficult to pick a "just right" book or one that is interesting to your child. Sarasota County Public Libraries are also a great place to go to discover books that your child will enjoy. The librarians love to guide people to books that they will find interesting. KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 3RD GRADE

- Movie Poster: Pretend the book is going to be made into a movie and create a poster to promote the movie.
- Compare and Contrast: Compare and Contrast the book to the movie (if there is a movie) OR to the other book that you read this summer using the attached Venn Diagram. Write a paragraph explaining which you liked best and why.
- Dress Up: Dress as one of the characters and come prepared to role play the character in front of class so we can ask you questions about the story.
- Draw a Scene: Choose your favorite scene from the book and draw it. Be able to explain to your teacher what is happening in your picture.
- Puppets: Create a puppet for each character and present a 1 2 minute puppet show about your book.
 Present it live or on video for the class. You can use others to help you. Write a paragraph explaining how your script relates to the novel.

4TH AND 5TH GRADE READING PROJECT

- Perspective: Retell a scene in the book from a different character's point of view. Do it as a written piece, but be ready to read it to your teacher as well.
- Model It: Build a miniature stage setting or diorama of a scene in the book. Include a written explanation of the scene.
- Write a Sequel: Write the first chapter or two for a sequel. Outline what would happen in the rest of book.
- Compare and Contrast: Compare and Contrast the book to the movie (if there is a movie) OR to the other book that you read this summer using the attached Venn Diagram. Write a paragraph explaining which you liked best and why.
- Book to Movie: Suddenly the book has become a best seller! Create a movie poster complete with actors
 you have chosen for each part. On the back of your poster, do a write up of each character (telling
 something about them) and why you chose the actor you did for each part. (This is a characterization
 assignment more than an artwork, so spend more time on the characters than your drawing. It's more
 important.)
- Conflict Dissection: Use the attached graphic organizer and tell who the main characters are, the setting, the conflict, and the solution of your book.
- Comic Strip: Use the attached template and take a scene from your book, and turn it into a comic strip. Please be sure to include enough written dialogue between characters so the reader knows exactly what is going on. If you need to do one longer than six boxes, feel free to print two! (Template available.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

- Comic Book: Write a comic book version of your book. Use 8 ½ x 11 inch paper. Create the book on the full
 page or folded in half. Comics should be colored. (You can use the attached graphic organizer for this if you
 wish.)
- Compare and Contrast: Compare and Contrast the book to the movie (if there is a movie) OR to the other book that you read this summer using the attached Venn Diagram. Write a paragraph explaining which you liked best and why.
- Conflict Dissection: Use the attached graphic organizer and tell who the main characters are, the setting, the conflict, and the solution of your book.
- Reading VLOG: After finishing the novel, record a video of your thoughts and feelings about the book.
 Include a short synapsis of the book (include the main characters) and whether or not you would recommend this book to your peers. The video should be approximately 3 minutes long.
- Playwrite: Read the same book with a friend. Rewrite a chapter in your book as a play and preform it with your friend for class.
- Amazon Listing Novel Project: Use the attached graphic organizer and create an Amazon Listing for your book. Do it in the same format as the example. You will have to have some computer skills to do this one!
- Plot Graph: Use the attached plot graph to plot the main points for your book. You will also have to identify the climax, conflict, and resolution for this project.
